## EDUCATION COURSE SEQUENCE

The Sequence prepares a student for Student Teaching through planning the learning activities within the classroom and understanding the learning development of a specific age. Students will integrate and apply knowledge from their entire program while teaching in collaboration with experienced teachers in the public schools with university guidance and supervision.

### Additional Information:

1. Block and Student Teaching courses are available in the **Fall and Spring semesters only**.
2. **All CI and RDG** must be completed with a "C" or better.
3. **All degree/certification** coursework must be completed prior to the Student Teaching semester.
4. **Additional courses may be taken with Methods courses and Field Based Block.**
5. Utilize placement services provided by Career Services (<http://www.careerservices.txstate.edu/>).

### Methods Courses – Maybe taken anytime prerequisites are met.

CI 3310 Public Education in America

- **Prerequisites:** 60 hrs. complete; must be completed with "C" or better.
- **Must be complete before the Field Based Block.**

CI 3325 Adolescent Growth and Development

- **Prerequisite:** 60 hours, complete, 2.5 Texas State GPA; must be completed with "C" or better.

### Field Based Block – completed the semester before student teaching; must be completed with grades of "C" or better.

### Prerequisites:

1. **An application** is required for the **Field Based Block** and should be submitted **prior to the Advanced Registration** period deadline. Applications are available in the **Curriculum and Instruction Department**.
2. Students must have **60 hours complete** and **2.5+ Texas State GPA** in order to enroll in the **Field Block** (CI 4332, 4343, RDG 3323) and completion of CI 3310 with "C" or better.
3. Students must earn **"C" or better in ENG 1310, and ENG 1320** prior to enrolling in the Field Based Block.
  - **Attend Student Teaching Roundup** at the start of this semester; refer to <http://www.education.txstate.edu/subpages/acadshared/studentteaching.html> for dates and locations. This meeting is MANDATORY and begins the Student Teaching Application process.
  - Students are required to **take practice tests** (Content Area and Pedagogy & Professional Responsibility) for the TExES (Texas Examination of Educator Standards) during this semester. Refer to <http://www.education.txstate.edu/subpages/excet/index.htm> for additional information.

### Student Teaching – final semester, after all coursework has been completed.

- **Apply for graduation** at the start of the semester. See Schedule of Classes for deadline. Applications are available on line at [http://www1.txstate.edu/catsweb/ad/adwbadgra\\_instructions.htm](http://www1.txstate.edu/catsweb/ad/adwbadgra_instructions.htm).
- **Take required TExES exams:** Pedagogy and Professional Responsibility Test #160 and Health All-Level Test # 157 are required. If **Second Teaching Field is completed**, the student must take appropriate **TExES/ExCET content exam in addition** to Pedagogy and Professional Responsibility and Health Education All-Level test. (All practice tests must be completed to take the "real" exam").
- Upon **completion of all certification requirements** (student teaching, graduation, and passing scores on required TExES exams), apply for certification on-line. Refer to Teaching Certification application procedures online at <http://www.education.txstate.edu/subpages/acadshared/edcert.html>.

Students are ultimately responsible for knowing and fulfilling all University, College, Major and Certification requirements. Failure to meet requirements and stated deadlines may delay graduation. Students who, at any time, are confused about academic requirements for their progress toward a degree and certification are encouraged and expected to meet with an advisor, adhering to the posted advising schedules and procedures.
